October 31 - Grant Deadline

November 2 - Registration begins for the Needle Nanny Workshop





THE NEEDLE NANNY WORKSHOP will take place on Thursday, November 30 - a fun little project using the plastic insert from Starbucks Keurig coffee pods, threads of your choice and a couple of magnets to make a colourful needle minder or fridge magnet. The workshop is only an hour and we will be offering it at 10:00 am and again at 1:30 pm to accommodate as many members as possible. Registration starts on Thursday, November 2, and ends on November 23. See Sonya or email registrar@lcsg-gtal.ca to get you name on the list. There will be a fee of \$5 (cash only please) collected in class on November 30 to cover the cost of the kit (printed colour instructions, 2 rare earth magnets and the plastic insert). Bring your own thread (size equal to pearl cotton #5 or larger) or use threads from the guild stash. P.S. You can also use this technique to make a small ornament, so if you use this brand of Keurig pods, save the plastic insert that is hidden below the coffee.

WE ARE LOOKING FOR items that contain some form of hand embroidery. Stitched cards (Christmas and general purpose) and ornaments are our bestsellers. However, if you wish to donate other stitched items, feel free!

In order to give us adequate time to price all of the items, please bring your contributions to Mary as soon as they are ready. They will be gladly accepted at any guild meeting. We would like to have the ready-to-sell **donated items** no later than **Thursday**, **November 16**, as we will do the **pricing on Friday**, **November 17**, at Mary's house.

Remember that the Salon is also an opportunity for you to sell your own embroidered **items on consignment**. You set your own price and you get the proceeds of the sale less 15% that is retained by the guild. We also ask that if you wish to consign any framed item that is more than 12 inches in any dimension, you let us know so that we can request an easel that will support it. If you are planning to offer items on consignment, please review the <u>guidelines</u> and the <u>form</u> available on our website or see Mary for the information and the form that will need to accompany your items. You will need to bring your consignment items no later than **Thursday, November 16** to CNL. Otherwise, you will have to bring your consignment items to Mary's house or make some other arrangement.

We will need **volunteers to help set up** our display tables on the **Friday, November 24 (4:00 – 6:00 pm)** and to help out at the **sales** and **demonstration** table on **Saturday and Sunday**. Mary has the sign-up sheet for this.
